A PONZI SCHEME BY ANY OTHER NAME: IS IT SO SWEET?

The panel will discuss the range of issues that Receivers need to consider if they have, or think they may have, a Ponzi scheme case. The benefits and burdens of a label of a Ponzi scheme will be addressed, along with the key elements necessary to establish a Ponzi scheme. One of the potential benefits – the Ponzi Scheme Presumption – will be analyzed to best equip a receiver and receiver's team in navigating through what can be complex and potentially costly litigation. A Ponzi scheme finding also has less obvious benefits in the claims and distribution process as well in tax administration, and the interplay with parallel criminal proceedings can result in additional benefits.

EVERY ROSE HAS ITS THORN: A PRACTICAL REVIEW OF THORNY DISCOVERY ISSUES

Receivers involved in litigation often face thorny issues related to discovery. This panel will provide a practical over view to such questions as: Who controls the attorney-client privilege? Does the answer change if counsel was representing more than one party? Has all potential evidence been preserved and does the receiver have the ability to comply with discovery demands? What are the consequences if such potential evidence hasn't been preserved or the receiver can't compel production, e.g. servers are in Panama or computers need a password? What is required for a witness to properly assert the privilege against self-incrimination? Does it make a difference if the statements are given informally?
