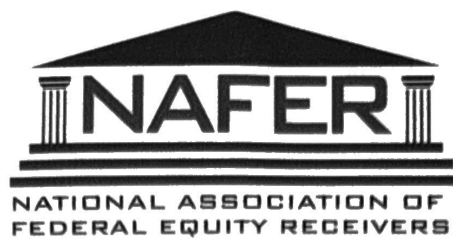

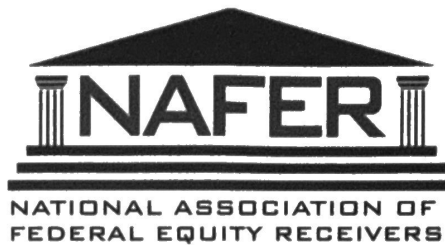

- 1. Describe why you would like to be a member of the NAFER Board:** I would like to help expand the membership beyond its distinguished group of core members by targeting individuals who are likely to be our next prominent receivers, continue to aggressively advance the goal of making the organization the standard by which receivers and their professionals are appointed, and advance the organization's role in assisting with teaching and marketing its members, particularly focusing on its younger members, to make the organization as attractive as possible.
- 2. Describe any significant efforts you have participated in on behalf of NAFER:** I currently sit on NAFER's Board of Directors. I have served as the co-chair of the Membership Recruitment Committee for nearly two years; before that, I was an active member of the Committee. While I have been co-chair, the Membership Recruitment Committee has overseen several new and continuing initiatives, including the "Delegate" or "Ambassador" program, which connects experienced members with new attendees prior to the annual conference in order to introduce them to the conference and make them feel connected and welcomed, and Zoom meetings for new members, welcoming them to NAFER, and introducing them to NAFER's committees and some more experienced members. I've also been a member of the International Committee and helped to plan and implement several of the International Conferences. In 2022, I was a presenter at the National Conference on a panel on Interagency Cooperation. In 2021, I moderated a panel at the National Conference entitled "The Ethical Receiver: Balancing the Demands as a Neutral Party". I previously moderated a cross-border insolvency panel discussion at the NAFER Offshore Insolvency and Asset Recovery Conference in Chicago. I have also attended and participated in the last several annual conferences.



3. **Describe any significant efforts you have participated in to improve the receivership process:** I have written articles on and spoken about the Uniform Commercial Real Estate Receivership Act in Michigan, encouraging best practices and modifications to the law to ensure due process. I volunteered to teach new business court judges in Michigan about receivership law in an effort to organize education for these judges. I moderated a panel for my local bar association which included our local business court judges related to several post-judgment remedies which prominently included receivership issues. I am in the process of moderating a series of three panel discussions on receiverships for Financial Poise in partnership with NAFER. I also recently served as a panelist in a NAFER webinar discussing various aspects of state court receiverships and comparing receivership law in several states.
4. **Describe any significant efforts you have participated in on behalf of your specific profession:** Most importantly, I have strived to act in accordance with what I consider to be the high ethical standards that I believe attorneys should have, and have encouraged others to do so. I have also participated extensively in my local bar associations, the Oakland County Bar Association and the Detroit Bar Association. I founded and created the Debtor/Creditor Committee in the Oakland County Bar Association to address debtor/creditor issues of local importance and chaired the Committee for five years. In 2017 the Committee won the award for Committee of the Year under my Chairmanship. 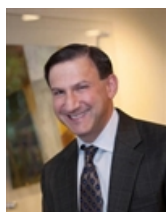

1. Describe why you would like to be a member of the NAFER Board:

As a member of NAFER for the past 13 years, I have served on four committees, I currently chair the Non-Regulatory Receivership Committee, I previously co-chaired the Regulatory Subcommittee of the Outreach Committee (before it was a separate Committee) for approximately 4 years, I produced and served as a panelist for a Session at the 2025 Annual Conference, I attended all but the first Annual Conference, and I authored articles published in the Receiver. Further, I have worked on 23 federal equity receivership arising from SEC, CFTC, and FTC enforcement actions in multiple federal districts courts in five states, as the Receiver, lead counsel for the Receiver, or co-counsel for the Receiver, over the past 23 years (of my 28 years practicing law). As such, I believe can help expand NAFER's purview and programming to include non-regulatory receiverships in federal and state court, help NAFER nurture existing and foster new relationships with federal judges and regulators, continue to improve the content and utility of its website and the resources it offers to members, judges, and regulators, and encourage younger receivership practitioners to join NAFER, participate in its committees, conferences, and initiatives, take leadership roles, and ensure NAFER's continued status and reputation as the nation's preeminent receivership association.

2. Describe any significant efforts you have participated in on behalf of NAFER:

As the current chair of the Non-Regulatory Receivership Committee, I have worked with Committee members and NAFER leadership to devise and refine the mission of the Committee, I have guided the Committee through



its formulation and adoption of a three-prong action plan, and, in furtherance of one of those prongs, I have prepared a comprehensive outline on non-regulatory receiverships that can be used for NAFER educational programming and presentations to other organizations interested in learning about such receiverships.

Previously, I served as the Co-Chair (with Peter Zlotnick) of the Regulatory Subcommittee of the Outreach Committee when Burt Wiand was its Chair. Together, we compiled one of the first NAFER databases of federal regulators throughout the country, we prepared and sent letters to those regulators introducing NAFER and the resources it can provide to regulators, and scheduled and attended, on behalf of NAFER, several in-person meetings with regulators in multiple jurisdictions to further discuss NAFER and how its resources and experienced members can assist regulators in enforcement actions, and to invite them to attend and speak at the NAFER annual and regional conferences. The regulators we met seemed very interested in NAFER and some of them even attended future NAFER conferences. I was proud to serve as an ambassador to NAFER and, even after my Chairship, I continued to do so, sharing NAFER's mission and promoting its benefits to anyone who will listen.

3. Describe any significant efforts you have participated in to improve the receivership process:

From 2016 through 2020, as the Chair of the Florida Bar Business Law Section Task Force on the Uniform Commercial Real Estate Receivership Act (UCRERA), I spearheaded the effort to have UCRERA enacted into law in Florida. UCRERA, Florida's first statute to govern real estate receiverships, provides a robust framework for the appointment of receivers and the administration of real estate receiverships, expanding the court's powers to appoint receivers, enumerating the powers, duties, and liabilities of receivers and the rights and obligations of the property owners, facilitating the preservation of the value of the subject property and prevention of dissipation or waste, and, under certain circumstances, authorizing the sale of property free and clear of all liens in order to maximize value for the benefit of all interested parties. The Task Force, comprised of Florida Bar members from the Bankruptcy/UCC Committee, the Business Litigation Committee, and the Corporations Committee, worked for four years on revising and refining UCRERA, receiving input from the Florida Bar Real Property Probate and Trust Law Section, the Florida Bankers Association, the Florida Land Title Association, and



the Uniform Law Commission. The Task Force then worked with the Business Law Section's lobbyists in Tallahassee to shepherd the Act through the Legislature. After several Committee hearings, UCRERA passed both the House and the Senate unanimously and was signed into law by Florida's Governor in July 2020.

4. Describe any significant efforts you have participated in on behalf of your specific profession:

From 2022 through 2024, I served as the Chair, First Vice-Chair, and Second Vice-Chair, after many years of being an active member, of the Bankruptcy/UCC Committee of the Business Law Section of the Florida Bar. This Committee, the purview of which includes receiverships and other fiduciary appointments, is probably the largest and most active Committee of the Business Law Section, having multiple Study Groups and members leading efforts to propose, revise, and enact significant legislation in Florida, producing continuing legal education programs on bankruptcy, UCC, and receivership-related subjects throughout the state, and formulating, promoting, and participating in state-wide pro bono, financial literacy, and diversity, equity, and inclusion initiatives. After serving as the Bankruptcy/UCC Committee Chair, I served as the Chair of the Business Law Section's Bankruptcy Judicial Liaison Committee, which facilitates the exchange of ideas on issues important to, and fosters the relationships between and among, members of the bench and bar. I believe my contributions through these Committees of the Business Law Section, as a leader and active member for more than a decade, have had a significant positive impact on my profession as a lawyer and receiver.

5. Describe any other items you would like for the voters to consider:

More than ten years ago, I created the website ReceiversReport.com because I thought it would be useful to have an online resource that highlights recent developments and established principles of law relevant to receivers, trustees, other fiduciaries, and their counsel, accountants, and other professionals. ReceiversReport.com features articles and posts from attorneys at my law firm and other firms about important court decisions, statutes, rules, and other legal authority and equitable principles that may be helpful to or otherwise impact the cases and practices of fiduciaries and their professionals and other legal practitioners. Visitors to the website can easily search for cases, holdings, or other information by subject matter, keyword, jurisdiction, and author, and anyone is welcome to submit articles and posts for consideration for publication.
